### **ACADEMICS AT AUBURN**

### **ACADEMIC COACHING**

WHAT: A free personalized program where students partner with a graduate-level coach to implement action steps to achieve academic and personal goals.

WHY: Students learn strategies to improve learning habits and skills covering areas such as time management, test-taking, reading comprehension, and more.

HOW: Schedule your Academic Coaching appointment using Advise Assist (on students' AU Access page).



### STUDY PARTNERS

WHAT: A free peer tutoring program for a variety of core courses. Tutoring is offered as one-on-one appointments for undergraduate students.

WHY: Students work through challenging course-specific content and grow as confident, self-directed, learners.

HOW: Schedule your peer tutoring appointment using Advise Assist (on students' AU Access page) or via Knack app (see Academic Support website).

# SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION (SI)

WHAT: Free, twice a week, interactive review sessions planned by students who successfully completed the course.

WHY: Students gain content mastery, make peer connections, and develop skills for academic success in historically difficult core classes.

HOW: If their course is supported by SI, students will receive communications from their SI Leader with dates, times, and the location for their SI sessions.

# UNIV 2100 Peer Education in Higher Ed

WHAT: 1- credit hour course taught by Academic Support staff that provides a chance to consider the ways one learns and grows through experiences as a peer educator at AU.

On campus employment is a great way to gain a sense of belonging at college, and there are many opportunities across campus as a peer educator. UNIV 2100 is designed to help you prepare for or make sense of those experiences.

WHAT: Academic Support employs over 100 undergraduate students every semester as Peer Tutors, SI Leaders and Front Desk Representatives.


